2026 marks the 21st year for the Haymarket Regional Food Pantry. 21 years marked by vast changes in our area, in our demographics, in our numbers of clients. Through all the change we have stayed true to our Mission set forth by our Founders:

**“We are dedicated to eliminating hunger by providing food to those in need of assistance in Haymarket, Gainesville and surrounding areas.”**

In our twenty-one-year history we have not wavered from that stated purpose and in turn have provided food to well over half a million individuals. What has changed is how we provide the food – now in a highly respectful “Select Pantry” model where our clients chose the items they need for that week. **Gone are the days of bags handed out – our clients are able to select from the 52 items always on our shelves.**

These items are supplemented by fresh produce, milk, eggs, prepared meals and a variety of proteins. As always, our clients can visit us once per week.

We continue to support our mission with our all-volunteer teams – again as our Founders specified. Our volunteers pick up food, put it away, distribute it, make appointments, run our children’s programs, write thank you letters and mail end of year documents. We could not do it without them! **We are so fortunate to have the best volunteers on the planet!**

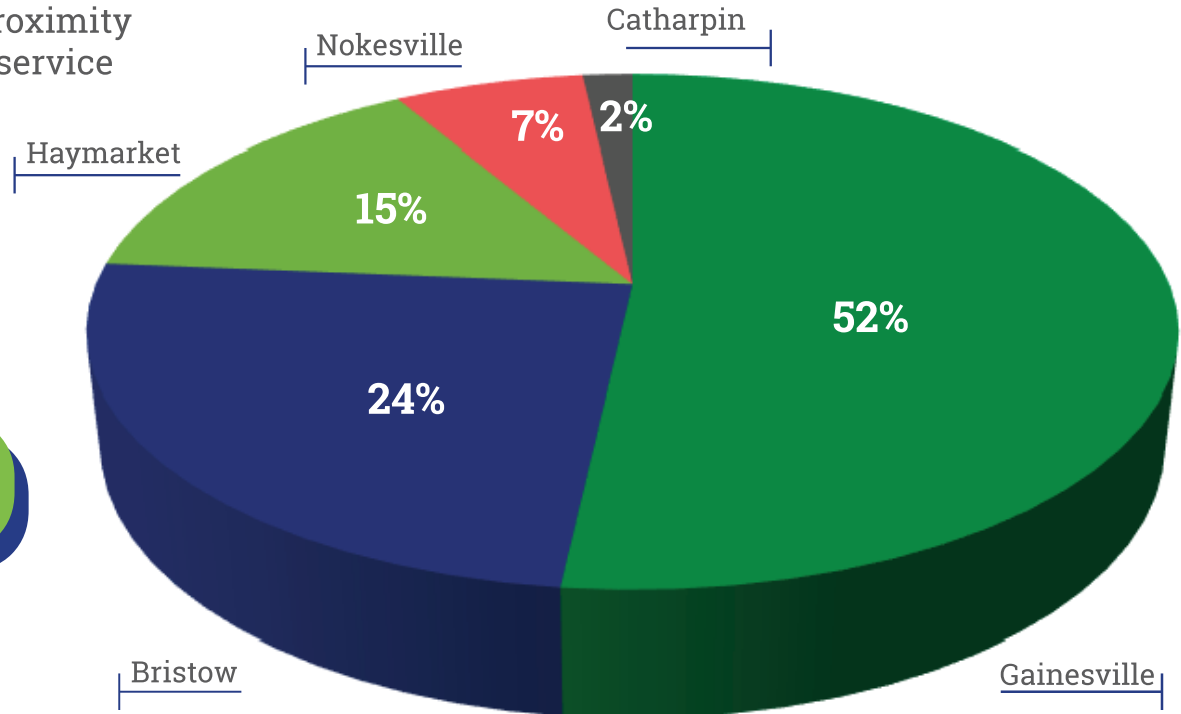
# Food Insecurity in Prince William County

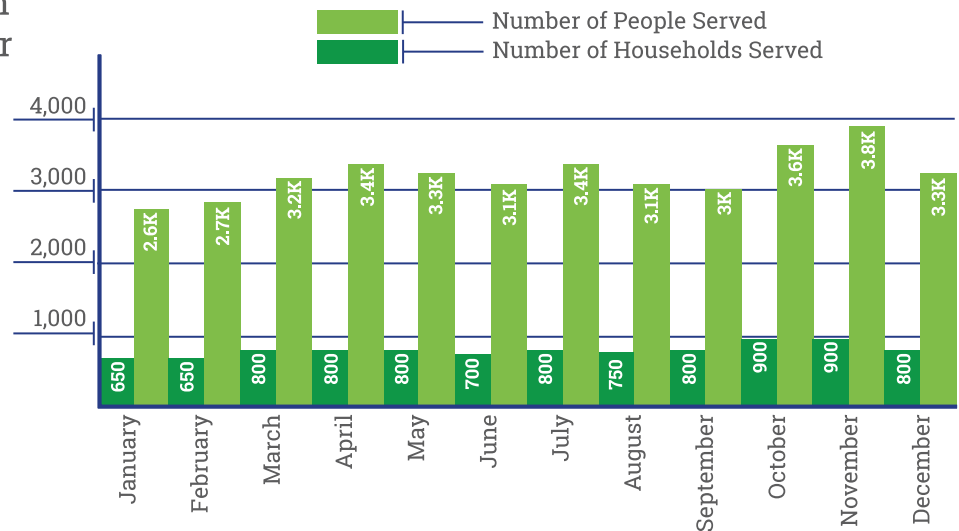
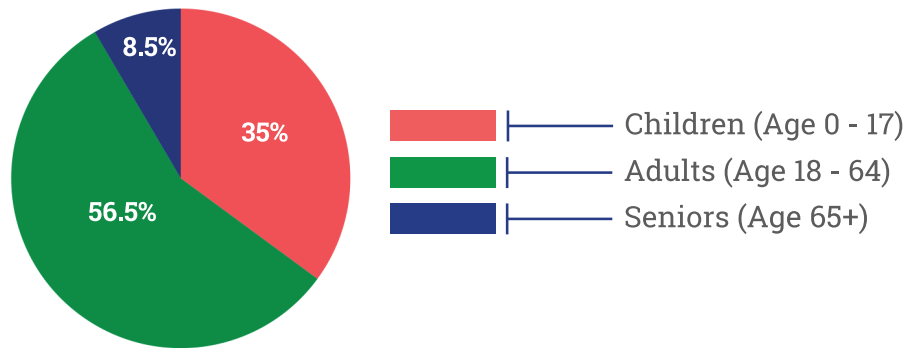

# Our Clients

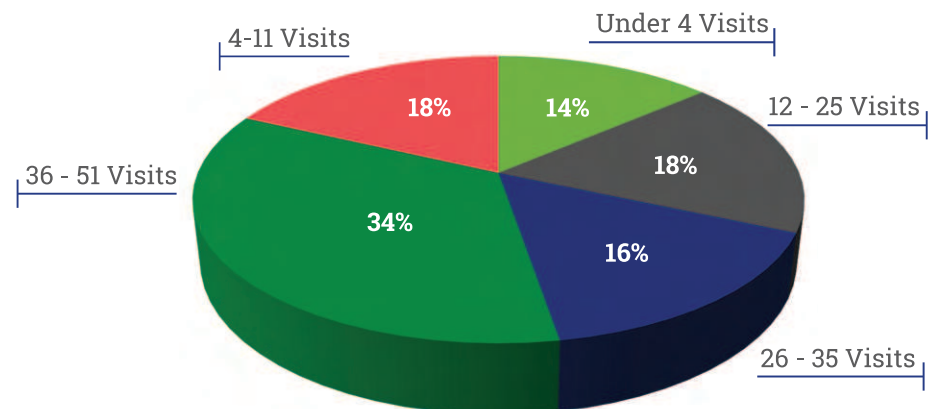

## Age Demographics of Our Clients



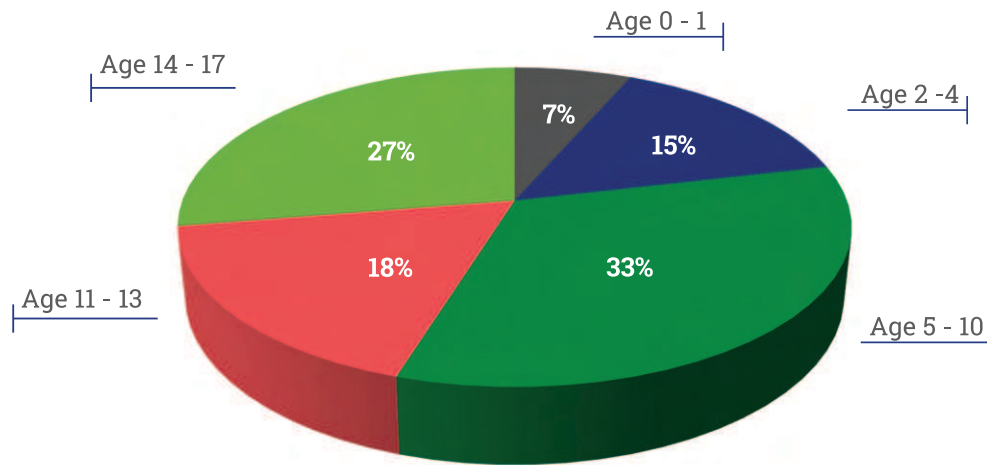

## Children Served by Age



The Haymarket Regional Food Pantry services a significant number of our region's hungry children. Children require a different level of care, so we have programs just for them. Our birthday bag program ensures that each child receives essentials for their special day. These supplies are enhanced by our partnership with Cakes4Kids. Cakes4Kids provides a special cake or treat to the children celebrating a birthday, milestone or graduation. This partnership has proven incredibly popular with our clients and their children.

In 2025 we partnered with Boxes of Basics to provide a seasonal wardrobe for our client children – another program wholeheartedly valued by our clients. Further, when school is out – fall, winter, spring or summer we provide snack packs that include breakfast items, lunch items as well as snacks and drinks.

# Our Facility

We are so fortunate to have our “Select Pantry” and “Warehouse” adjacent to each other. Many operations like ours need offsite storage that require making trips back and forth to stock their shelves - we just walk next door. Due to this and vigilant inventory management, we are able to keep the same 52 items on our shelves each week so our clients know what to expect. These staples are supplemented by fresh food that varies as the seasons change.

# Our Volunteers

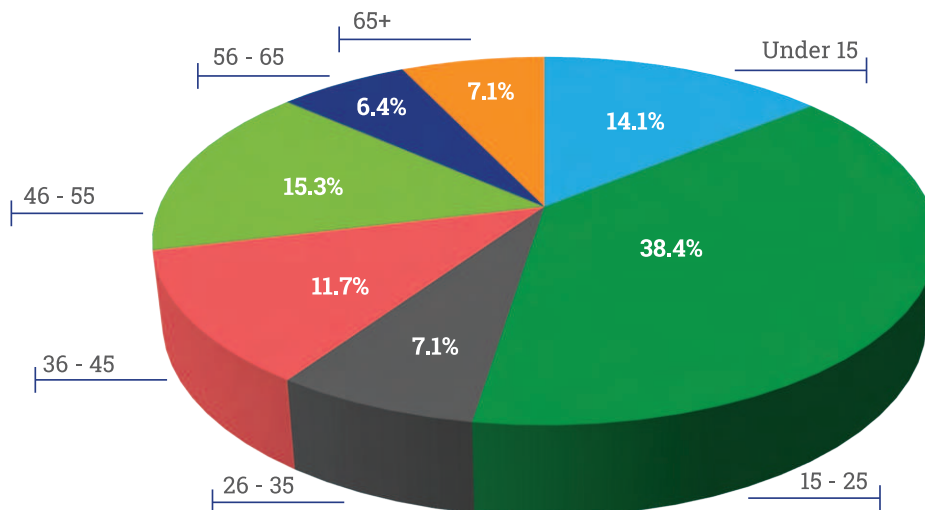


One of the differentiators of the Haymarket Regional Food Pantry is our lack of paid staff, we are 100% volunteer run.

**Our team works over 500 hours weekly, 2,000 monthly and over 25,000 hours per year.**

We have volunteers who pick up food, put food away, stock shelves, order food, make appointments, fill out paperwork, write thank you letters, coordinate birthday cake deliveries, run distribution shifts, help clients select food, etc. We could not function without our amazing team. As the chart illustrates our volunteers are from all age groups with some helping us to fulfill volunteer hour requirements, some volunteer as a family and some help us out from home when their schedule allows.

# Our Food Sources

We are extremely fortunate to have many generous stores and farms surrounding us. Five days a week, our volunteers pick up food at area stores year-round. For six months a year our volunteers also pick up fresh produce at area farms. We could not do what we do without these partners and are extremely grateful for their consistent assistance. Additionally, we do purchase items from retailers and food providers including the Capital Area Food Bank, of which we are a long-time member. We have generous donors who help us offset these purchases with organizations underwriting milk, eggs, flour, cereal, pasta, beans, etc. Let us know if your group would like to underwrite an item or two.

Finally, we are also blessed with a plethora of community organizations who run much needed food drives for us. In 2025, organizations ran 50 food drives benefiting the HRFP.

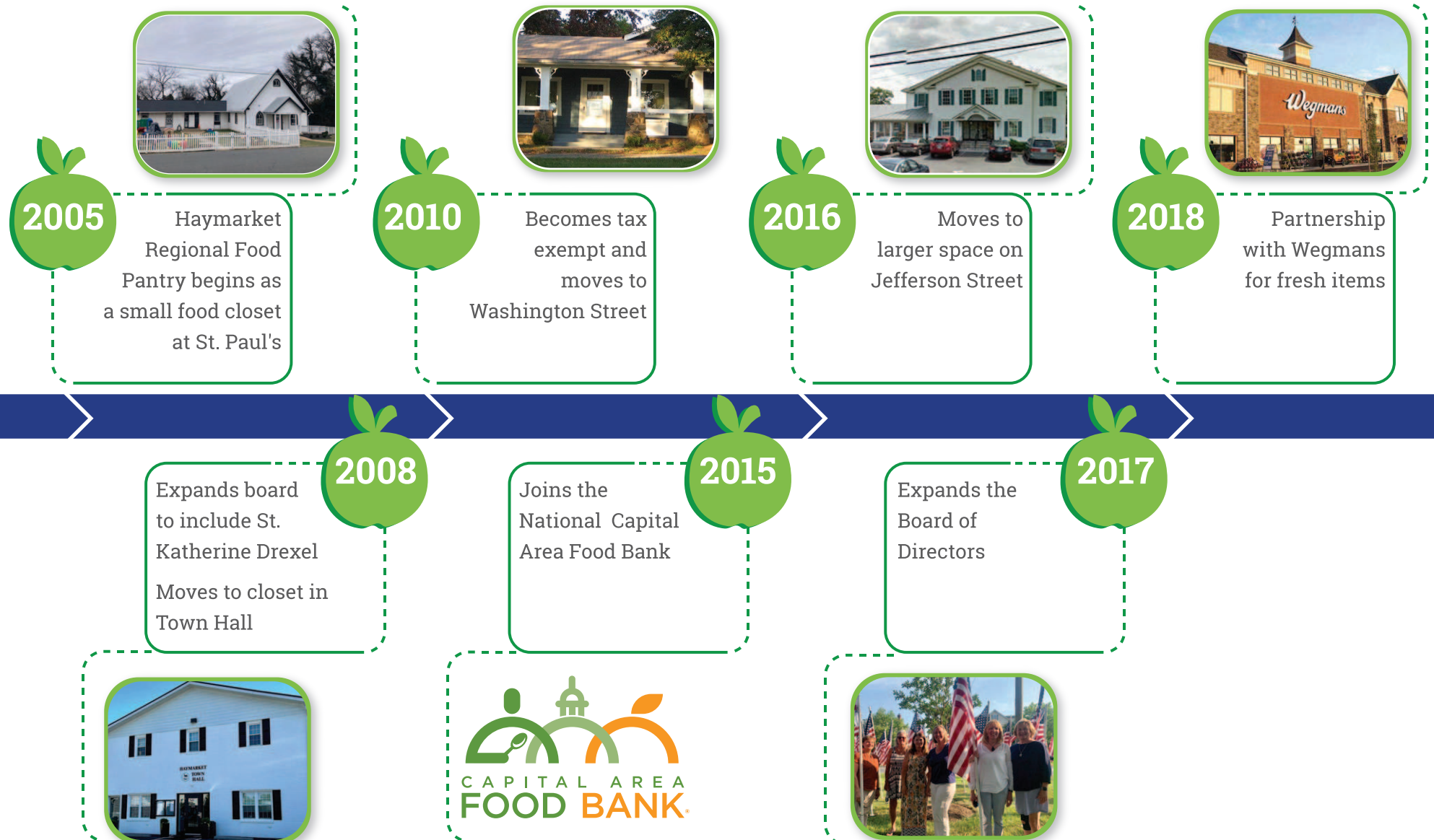
